

### A New Executive Director

### Life Sunday

### March for Life

On January 22, 2016, Rev. Salemink and LFL's Y4Life Director Laura Davis, as well as a delegation of Lutheran youth participants, were present at the March for Life in Washington, D.C.—testifying to the truth of the Gospel and demonstrating its power.

### New Board of Directors Members

At our February 2016 meeting, the board of directors of Lutherans For Life elected three new members: Deaconess Tiffany Manor, Dr. Sheila Page, and Rev. Charles St-Onge. Deaconess Manor resides in New Hartford, Connecticut, and serves the LCMS New England District caring for church workers and their families. Dr. Page lives in Aledo, Texas, where she practices neuromusculoskeletal medicine and testifies regarding life issues before state and federal legislatures. Rev. St-Onge is pastor of Ascension Lutheran Church in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, and Caribbean Area Facilitator for LCMS International Mission. The board also thanked Mr. Rich Greiner, Mr. Gary Mrosko, and Dr. Rodney Rathmann upon completion of their board service.

### An Open Letter

On January 6, 2016, LFL issued "An Open Letter to President Barack Obama" that reached over 255,000 people via Facebook, our website, and our weekly "Life Notes" email. The letter concluded, "Mr. President, we hope against hope that your views on abortion change, though we suspect they are very deeply imbued. But we do ask that you use your deep-felt anger over the children of Sandy Hook and other victims of gun violence to strive to have some empathy for ordinary people like us who have the same deep-felt anger over the tragedy of abortion."

In October, we rejoiced in launching the reviewed and revised Life Team Tools training during the LFL National Conference in Bloomington, Minnesota. Also in October, Hilary Haak, our mission and ministry director, was hired to help support and equip congregations as they go

Y4Life and its ministry had a great year in 2016,




