For 30 years God has blessed the educational work of Lutherans For Life and now there is a greater openness in the church to the message of LFL. Renewal For Life[®] transfers the responsibility of holding up life issues from Lutherans For Life and places it correctly on the Church. Let me tell you how it is working in my church.

Our pastors preach and teach on life issues. Confirmation classes focus on the Fifth Commandment, emphasize Scripture and the value of life, and educate about the life issues. Our women's group has taken it one step further by "adopting" a young pregnant

girl through our local crisis pregnancy center. One of our members meets with her weekly. Our women's Bible study group prays for her. We are providing for her physical needs, mentoring her, and will soon give her a baby shower to which all the women in the church will be invited.

This is the spirit of Renewal For Life[®]—renewing the Church to deal with the greatest issue of our time, the devaluing of God's gift of life. So get on board. Preach life, teach life, and equip and encourage your congregation to demonstrate the love of Christ to those around us. Dr. Lamb:

- Preached in 19 churches to 4,623 people.
- Taught 13 Bible studies to 488 people.
- Conducted 7 school chapels reaching 965 students.
- Spoke at 7 youth events and 278 youth.
- Led 11 seminars totaling 930 people.
- Spoke at two pastoral conferences to 384 pastors.
- Presented to 158 4th year students at 2 seminaries. Total 7,826

Grassroots

LFL is more than a national office in Iowa. Our state affiliates, chapters, Life Ministry Coordinators, and Life Advocates bring Good News to life in a variety of ways all across the country. Here are just a very few examples:

In 2009, 830,604 pieces of our materials were sold and thousands more given away at displays and presentations.

LifeDate

Currently our mailing list for LifeDate is 31,852. We probably get more positive comments on LifeDate than anything else we do. For example: *"The latest issue of 'LifeDate' was so good! It really rejuvenated me to get out the Life message in my locality."*

Web Site

LFL's web site offers in-depth information on all the life issues as well as daily updates on the latest news. It is used by pastors, educators, and students to do research on these issues based on the Word of God. Word of Hope

Word of Hope is the post-abortion ministry associated with Lutherans For Life. This national hotline averaged nearly 300 calls per month in 2009. Recently a Canadian number was established. Written and e-mail counsel is sought from military personnel and inmates in women's prisons. Many lives are being touched. From one of their clients: *"I will never forget talking to the director, Grace, for the first time. She loved me unconditionally and with her help I accepted the reality of what I had done and began to accept God's forgiveness for my sin of abortion."*


Geaching For Life[®]

LFL's day school curriculum integrates key For Life concepts into the subjects already being taught. Teachers are telling us that it is colorful, easy to use, and effective. In 2009, 107 full sets were sold along with 71 single grade units. We have plans to expand this curriculum into other areas including Sunday school, VBS, confirmation, youth, and adult studies.
