A new national poll finds that a majority of Americans support shifting funding away from Planned Parenthood to community health centers that don't do abortions. Robert Morris University conducted an extensive poll to discover the pro-life climate Alveda King, niece of Dr. Martin Luther in the nation, gender and class differences in pro-life views, attitudes on supporting Planned Parenthood funding, and the level of awareness of the existence of the undercover videos. The survey, conducted October 10-15, 2015, in the aftermath of the Planned Parenthood videos and in the midst of the Congressional budget debate, polled 1000 people, and had a margin of error of +/- 3%. It revealed some striking results. All respondents were asked which of three positions on abortion best reflected their own personal view: 21.1% responded as "pro-life" and opposed to all abortions; 32.4% responded as opposed to abortions except for the exceptions of rape, incest, and the mother's health. On December 11, 2015, the CDC released new numbers showing a 35% decline in US abortions between 1990 and 2010, to 17.7 abortions per 1,000 women between ages 15 and 44. 
