Study: Adult Stem Cells Can Cut Heart **Failure Deaths in Half** – A team of doctors has just published new findings showing another dramatic, life-saving application of adult stem cells, further undermining the case for harvesting stem cells from human embryos. The results of what is being called the largest trial of its kind ever conducted showed that stem cells harvested from a patient's bone marrow can cut deaths from end-stage heart failure in half. Recipients of stem cell therapy were also 37% less likely to require hospitalization in the following year. Further research is required to conclusively determine whether this will be a realistic treatment for heart disease, but lead author Dr. Amit Pate of the University of Utah expressed confidence: "These results suggest that it really works." If it proves viable, it is expected to also help mitigate shortages of donor organs. In other stem cell research news, scientists announced that they had successfully grown a human heart using **stem cells.** That in itself is a major development. But to the surprise of many, these stem cells did not come from embryos but rather skin cells, making this not only a major development but an ethical one too.
