Colorado voted to legalize physician-assisted suicide by an expected margin of around 65 percent to 33 percent—making the state the fifth to allow assistance in dying. Alex Schadenberg, executive director of the London, Ontario-based Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, says the result is distressing but not surprising. “People have been inundated with the message that this is about freedom, that this is about my autonomy, that there will be safeguards in place, when the fact is when you look at the reality, none of that is true.” Proposition 106 creates the “Colorado End of Life Options Act,” allowing doctors to prescribe lethal drugs to patients age eighteen and over who have been diagnosed with a terminal illness and have been assessed to have six or fewer months to live. 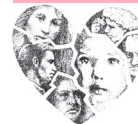
